UWinnipeg seeks candidates whose scholarship advances learning and knowledge through teaching, research and service in any of the above-mentioned areas.

Expertise in more than one area and interdisciplinary approaches are particularly welcome. While candidates with a PhD are preferred, ABD candidates and candidates with lived experience are also encouraged to apply. Candidates who are interested in applying to several areas should identify the areas to which they are applying in their letter and submit separate applications.

Interested candidates should apply directly to the posting with a cover letter outlining relevant experience in teaching and research; a curriculum vitae; a research and teaching statement outlining their contributions, or other evidence of effective teaching; and the names and contact information of three referees familiar with the candidate's Indigenous-specific teaching, research, and service. Candidates with interdisciplinary research areas are encouraged to submit to each area of interest.

This cluster hire search is **designated** for Indigenous candidates. Applicants should therefore provide a statement indicating their relationships to and with Indigenous nations, governments, and communities as well as how they self-identify as Indigenous (First Nations, Inuit, or Métis). In the later stages of the selection process, additional steps supporting the verification of Indigenous identity will occur for individuals who are invited to an interview with the selection committee.
